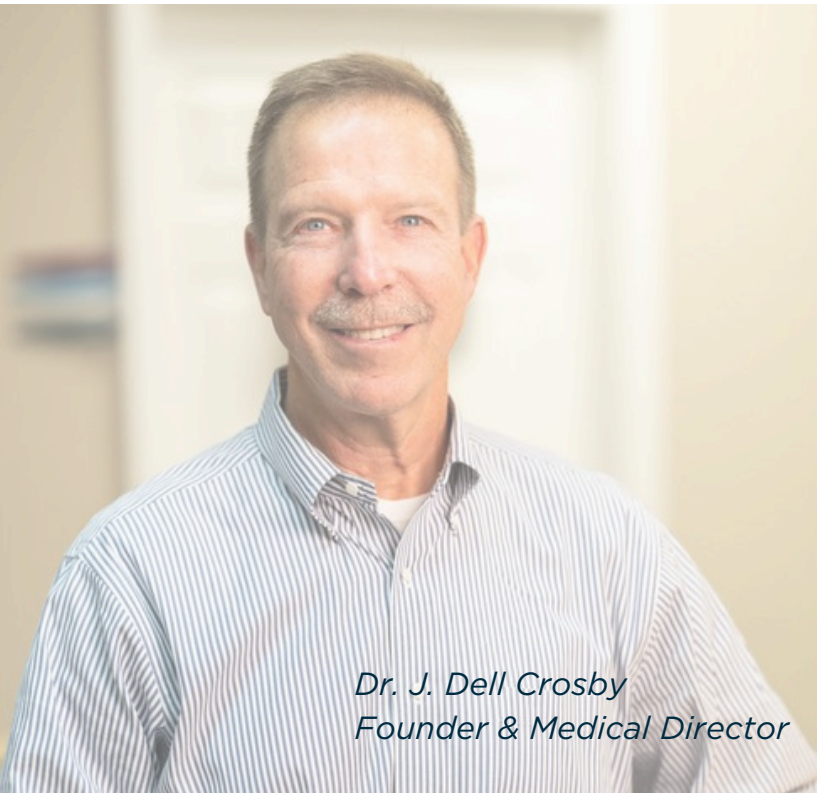

In early 2026, we will move into our new building, creating exciting opportunities to expand our reach and serve even more patients in need.

The additional space will allow us to better serve both current and future patients while creating room for expanded programs and services.

Through community partnerships and educational initiatives, we aim to provide additional resources such as transportation assistance for patients, as well as classes focused on nutrition, grocery budgeting, meal planning, and basic financial education.

These opportunities reflect Mercy Medical Ministry's ongoing commitment to caring for the whole person physically, spiritually, and practically. As we step into this next season, we remain confident in God's provision and grateful for the supporters, volunteers, and partners who make this mission possible.
